



This learner entitlement statement explains what you can expect from Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance at Fullbrook when you are in Key Stage 4.

What will you learn in the programme of Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance?

In years 10 and 11 you will be helped to:

- Identify and set life goals as well as learning targets
- Use debate, reflection, review and action planning to progress and help you to develop your career ideas
- Explain why it is important to develop personal views and values and be able to respond to the main influences affecting your learning and work
- Describe employment trends and learning opportunities at different levels
- Identify, select and use a wide range of information resources regarding careers and guidance
- Use work related learning/ experiences to shape your learning and career progression
- Understand the options open to you once you leave school, identify your priorities and explain the decisions that you make
- Take finance and other factors related to managing your money into consideration when making decisions
- Understand the purpose of careers lessons and be able to present personal information about yourself in a professional format
- Understand what employers are looking for in relation to behaviour at work. Appreciate your rights as well as their rights.





You will learn this through DLD Citizenship lessons by...

- Considering personal finance through DLD Citizenship lessons, including the costs of higher education and further education. You will learn to budget for your future and research bursaries available
- studying how people manage their personal finances and how this impacts upon their life decisions in different circumstances
- studying equal opportunities through DLD Citizenship lessons
- looking at Labour Market Trends through DLD Citizenship lessons

You will learn this through tutor time by...

- using the online careers programme such as U-Explore to help you identify careers and set goals and targets for your future learning and aspirations
- each tutor group will have a Careers Ambassador who will attend a session run by the Careers Department. The Ambassador will then feedback on the services available at Fullbrook to the rest of their tutor group
- All Year 10 students will create a CV in tutor time
- All Year 11 students will update their CV in tutor time
- speaking to colleagues from work based training centres and colleges as well as Fullbrook 6
- receiving interim grades 6 times a year. You will use these to reflect upon your progress and how this affects the decisions for your future
- completing 'Work in a Day'
- experiencing Post-16 options assemblies. You will be supported in the application process through tutor time
- sharing work experience feedback during tutor time
- You will be supported through tutor time to understand the various levels involved in Higher Education training and learning

You will learn this outside of lessons by...

- attending Careers Talks which will allow you to understand the demands of different careers and what they involve
- receiving an IAG interview with a member of SLT and your parents during Year 11
- All students have the opportunity to complete work experience in Year 10
- Some students will have a Business Learning Mentor during Year 10 and 11
