

Prom Strike System 2016-17

When will it start?

Tuesday 1st November

What will students receive strikes for?

1. Persistent poor punctuality to school - 6 Lates per half term with no acceptable reasons
2. Truancy
3. Fixed term exclusion from school
4. Extended day/ Staggered day/ (at Head of Learning/Senior Leadership Team discretion)
5. Disruption of Mock examination and tests (including classrooms)
6. Disruption of examinations/controlled assessments
7. Placed on Senior Leadership Team Report following failure to make progress on Tutor /Head of Learning Report (at Head of Learning/Senior Leadership Team discretion)
8. Persistent disruption to the learning of others and persistent poor behaviour in lessons and social time
9. Antisocial behaviour in school or out of school/on school trip/evening and weekends
10. Failure to complete GCSE/BTEC course
11. Unauthorised absence leading to Attendance below 96% at the end of each term (without a good medical reason supported by evidence)
12. Lack of Homework/Coursework resulting in being placed on Head of Learning Report

Automatic Prom Ban

- Students with poor attendance (less than 90% without a good medical reason supported by evidence)
- One off incident of gross misconduct, for example setting off the fire alarm
- Three Prom strikes
- No longer educated full time at Fullbrook **due to behaviour**

Student will be banned on receiving their third Prom strike

The Principal reserves the right to ban a student from the Prom for a one off incident of gross misconduct in consultation with the Governors

Managing Prom Strikes and communication to parents/students

1. Students have had the system communicated via **assembly (TBC)**
2. Strikes will be issued by Mr Baker in agreement with another member of the Senior Leadership Team **to ensure fairness.**
3. Parents will receive telephone communication and a letter of confirmation explaining why the strike has been issued.
4. When a student is at risk of receiving a Prom ban due to poor attendance, parents will be informed in writing **and invited to attend a meeting**
5. When a student is at risk of a Prom ban, parents will be informed in writing and **a meeting arranged**
6. School has the right to judge each case on its individual merits

Rewards for Year 11

1. £5 off Year book or Prom ticket for students who receive NO red behaviour slips from **1 November 2016**
2. Each Year 11 Tutor will nominate one student from their tutor group at the end of the year, to receive £5 off Year book or Prom ticket
3. Prize draw for students who have been nominated by their tutor and have received NO red behaviour slips, to receive either a free Year book or Prom ticket
