PE Kit Policy

The Fullbrook Physical Education Kit policy requires all students to change into their PE kit, even if they are excused from the practical element of the lesson. The only exception to this will be if a student is unable to change because of broken limbs, for example. On occasions when students are unable to do PE, they will be expected to take on a different role within the lesson. This might be as an official, coach or observer.

By wearing the Fullbrook PE kit, students who are not participating can ensure they stay warm and prevent their uniforms from getting dirty. If students fail to bring their kit, the usual sanction will apply. If a pupil is able to participate, but has forgotten their own kit, they will be provided with spare kit that they will be expected to wear so that they actively engage in their practical lesson.

Sanction Procedures:

Missing items / incorrect kit = 1 warning

3 warnings = 30 minute detention

No kit = 1 hour detention

Refusal to wear own kit / spare kit = 2 hour Head of Faculty detention

I understand that the school policy is to expect all pupils to hand in valuables when changing for PE. The school cannot accept responsibility where this is not done.

FULLBROOK UNIFORM ETHOS: DISCREET, SMART AND BUSINESS-LIKE

Dressing appropriately and modestly, following the dress code, shows respect for yourself and those you work with.

The list below should make our expectations clear.

Make-up and nail varnish should not be worn to school.

Hair should be of a reasonable length and no shorter than a grade 2. Patterns, shavings or colours that are not considered to be business-like are not appropriate for school.

Jewellery should not be worn to school. The school cannot take responsibility for items of value. Students should not wear items that could be a danger in PE, Science and Technology lessons. The only permitted items are a flat ring, a watch and one pair of small studs, one in each ear lobe, for those with pierced ears and no other body piercing to be worn to school.

UNIFORM LIST

BLAZER	Brown blazer with the official school badge (the badge is only available from the school suppliers).
SHIRT – Boys	Plain white button-up style to be tucked in and worn with a school tie showing six stripes.
BLOUSE – Girls	Revere open neck blouse designed to be worn outside the skirt. No other styles of shirt are allowed.
PULLOVER OR CARDIGAN	A dark brown V-necked school pullover with school logo or a plain dark brown, long sleeved, with school logo, V-necked button up cardigan may be worn under the blazer.
SHOES	Plain black and low heeled (no more than 5 cm in height). Boots, trainers, slingbacks, canvas shoes and platforms are not permitted.
SKIRT	Must be dark brown knee length A-line style and worn on the waist (no pleated skirts).
TROUSERS	Plain black tailored trousers. Girls regulation trousers should be purchased from the school uniform shop.
TIGHTS	These must be plain brown or neutral.
SOCKS	(a) With trousers, plain black or brown socks. (b) With a skirt, plain white ankle socks.
OUTDOOR COATS	These must not be worn in classrooms. Denim, multi-coloured or leather jackets or coats are NOT permitted, nor are hoodies, sweatshirts or tracksuit tops.
SCARVES	These can be worn with a coat. Like a coat, scarves should be removed when in lessons. If the weather is warm enough not to wear a coat then scarves should not be worn either.
HEADWEAR	Headwear (except on religious grounds) must not be worn inside the buildings, nor anywhere on the premises or approaches to school except in extreme weather conditions. Religious headwear should be plain and modest in colour (no patterns).
SUMMER UNIFORM	In the summer term, a white polo shirt with the school logo on may be purchased from the school shop to be worn by boys and girls without a tie in the summer term only . A blazer can be worn with the polo shirt but no pullover or cardigan. If students are cold, they should return to winter uniform.

Any items brought into school must not carry a drug related logo or abusive message.

All items of clothing and equipment should be clearly marked with the owner's name and tutor group. Any infringement of the uniform rules may lead to isolation or being sent home if it cannot be remedied.

The school shop on the school site is open every Wednesday during term time from 3.15 p.m. to 4.15 p.m. Opening times during school holidays can be obtained from the school website.
