

This learner entitlement statement explains what you can expect from Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance at Fullbrook when you are in Key Stage 5.

What can you expect from Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance at Fullbrook during Key Stage 5?

In Years 12 and 13 you will be helped to:

- use a range of self assessments to confirm short and long term goals and update your learning and career targets and aspirations
- assess personal self management and research skills in order to identify areas for development
- develop the knowledge and skills you need to progress and identify and take advantage of opportunities for adding to your experiences and achievements
- evaluate personal actions that you have taken to promote equal opportunities and respect for diversity
- evaluate the impact of external influences on your personal views, attitudes, behaviour and career plans
- make use of a range of information sources to explain how careers are changing and obtain careers information relevant to your personal needs
- describe different career routes through to your personal career goals and the similarities and differences between higher education and employment with training
- justify and evaluate the range of opportunities you are considering including HE training, employment or starting your own business
- take charge of your own career planning and management, evaluate previous learning transitions in order to inform future decisions
- follow application procedures correctly and appropriate self presentation techniques
- present yourself well at interview and demonstrate enterprise, negotiation, networking and self marketing
- obtain and manage sources of financial support



You will learn this through...

- A personalised tutoring system will support you to set realistic targets and goals with regular 1:1 academic monitoring sessions
- The UCAS process will engage you in analysing your strengths and skills and your previous attainment. You will be supported to use this effectively when looking at entry requirements for Further Education and careers that you may be interested in. You will plan towards meeting these requirements
- You are supported to recognise your previous attainments and current performance. This will help you to find areas where you need to improve in order to reach your goals
- Your subject teachers will use this information with you so that you can plan how to achieve your goals
- You will take part in an exciting and varied tutor programme which will support you to evaluate your transitions from Year 11 - 12 and 12 - 13. You will use your reflections to help you in the future
- You will have the opportunity to take part in the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award to improve your skills and personal marketability
- You will have the opportunity to take part in enriching learning opportunities such as World Challenge
- You will have the opportunity to take part in Young Enterprise Scheme
- You will have the opportunity to complete the EPQ programme
- You are expected to complete a work experience placement in Year 12
- Fullbrook 6 encourages you to take a balanced approach to employment in order to supplement your studies. There are opportunities for paid employment in the Fullbrook community

- PLTS sessions are delivered through the tutor programme
- Former F6 students will return and share their HE experiences with you if you are interested in similar careers pathways
- There is the opportunity to attend internal and external Oxbridge evenings as well as Oxbridge study days
- There are peer mentoring opportunities available. You will receive training to develop your skills in order to support GCSE students
- The Fullbrook 6 leadership team is elected by the student body. All students have the opportunity to take part in this process
- All students have the opportunity to attend career talks
- You will take part in the Safe Drive, Stay Alive programme, alcohol awareness and Progress Day. All of these help you to reflect on your views and attitudes and how this may influence you in planning for your future
- There is a dedicated F6 UCAS area
- Independent careers advice is available on request
- You will be encouraged to attend University Open Days and make full use of the college admissions website (UCAS)
- There is Progress Day at the end of Year 12 that includes information on Universities and UCAS as well as work based training. There will be Q&A sessions and Personal Statement support for you as well as interview skills and techniques
- You are given 1:1 tutor support and guidance on writing a personal statement which will represent all of your skills and abilities well
- There is a developing university Open Day visit blog



- You can attend the Higher Education evening for students and their parent held in Year 12
- There are a number of websites and resources shared through the 6th form weekly bulletin relating to options after KS5
- Information is made available to students about the Fullbrook Bursary
- Support is available to identify sources of finance to continue studies post F6
- You will have the opportunity to attend the Surrey HE Convention
- You will experience student finance presentations.
