



This learner entitlement statement explains what you can expect from Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance at Fullbrook when you are in Key Stage 3.

What will you learn in the programme of Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance?

In years 7,8 and 9 you will be helped to:

- Understand yourself and know who and what plays a part in how you think about yourself and the things that matter to you
- Think about what you expect of yourself and what others expect of you
- Develop confidence in yourself and in your abilities through DLD Citizenship lessons and Academic Monitoring
- Investigate ways to develop as a person
- Understand how the world of work is changing and the skills that you need in order to do well in your future life and career
- Learn how to plan ahead and deal with all kinds of changes as they happen to you.
- Learn how to manage and overcome the difficulties that you may face
- Know who is there to help you in school and exactly what they can do for you. Staff will listen to you and help you change your plans as things happen to you in and out of school.





You will be able to self assess your achievements, qualities, skills and abilities through...

- Academic monitoring with your tutor
- Thinking about how your interests might relate to your option choices and career path during DLD Citizenship
- Learning work based skills in Year 7 through PLTS lessons

You will use self assessments to identify areas for development, build self confidence and develop a positive self image through...

- Identifying the areas you need to improve in all of your subjects

You will use reflection, review, goal setting and action planning to support progress and achievement through...

- Setting regular goals and targets in all of your lessons
- Reflecting on your progress and achievements regularly with your tutor
- Setting SMART targets for yourself

You will recognise stereotyped and inaccurate images of people, careers and work. You will understand how these issues can affect decision making through...

- Recognising stereotypical views of 'work' and the workplace in DLD Citizenship lessons
- Consideration of stereotyping of GCSE option choices through tutor time, Citizenship, Choices assemblies and Choices evening

You will recognise the main influences on your attitude towards learning, work and equal opportunities for all through...

- Lessons during Year 7 PLTS which focus on how your family and friends may influence your learning
- Explaining your contribution to the work of a team during lessons where you are involved in group work
- Considering equal opportunities through the SMSC tutor activities



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
