## MESSAGE FROM RUNNYMEDE BC

We are aware there are delays in issuing supermarket e-Vouchers for those who receive free school meals and this is, potentially, creating financial distress for families.

Runnymede Borough Council (RBC) would like to make sure you are aware that they, in partnership with the Runnymede Foodbank, can provide Foodbank parcels for families in need, and are here to help.

The Runnymede Foodbank is fully operational, 7 days a week, and anyone in financial distress, or missing school vouchers because of delays, can call the council on **01932 83 83 83** and we will organise a Foodbank parcel to be delivered.

RBC have setup this central service to assist residents during these difficult times. Our welfare line can advise residents on the various support measures available, which include:

- Requesting food parcels
- Collecting prescriptions or shopping for those in self-isolation
- Advice on Universal Credit
- Housing support
- Council tax relief

If you find yourself in difficulty, then please do reach out to Runnymede Borough Council for further support.

## DIABETES UK

Following on from the communications by the NHS last week to encourage parents to continue to consult with medical staff should they have concerns about their children's health, paediatric diabetes consultants are concerned that diagnoses of diabetes might be missed or delayed if parents are unaware of the signs, and are worried about consulting with doctors over what they might initially consider 'mild' symptoms. 
