# Currently, there is a lot of misrepresentations of religion in the media, especially Islam.

- Many words like 'terrorism' and 'Jihad'
  get thrown around as evidence that
  Islam is a violent religion, however, 'Jihad'
  is actually the name given to war made
  in a lawful and fair way, the way of God.
- Christianity (amongst other faiths) is often cited as being a religion of love, but as you will see on the following slide, it has had its violent moments.



#### Fullbrook Herem vs jihad

- There is a specific kind of warfare laid down in the Bible which we can only call genocide."
- It is called *herem*, and it means total annihilation. Consider the Book of I Samuel, when God instructs King Saul to attack the Amalekites: "And utterly destroy all that they have, and do not spare them," God says through the prophet Samuel. "But kill both man and woman, infant and nursing child, ox and sheep, camel and donkey."
- When Saul failed to do that, God took away his kingdom.
- "In other words," Jenkins says, "Saul has committed a dreadful sin by failing to complete genocide."
- Jenkins notes that the history of Christianity is strewn with herem. During the Crusades in the Middle Ages, the Catholic popes declared the Muslims Amalekites. In the great religious wars in the 16th, 17th and 19th centuries, Protestants and Catholics each believed the other side were the Amalekites and should be utterly destroyed.



However, it seems unlikely that just based on this part, we would condemn all Christians as violent and dangerous.

Why is this?

Let's look at some of the bad things done in the name of religion – does it match up to our stereotypes?



- A country with which national religion is currently setting up "re-education" camps to target another religion (in which many people are dying)?
- A country with which national religion has been recently accused of genocide against another religious group?
- A country with which national religion has built a wall to keep out asylum seekers?
- Terrorist factions claiming to represent the interests of which religious group has committed over 50 terrorist attacks in the UK?
- A country with which religion in power has recently decided that anyone can apply for citizenship except for those from a different religion?



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Hinduism – Indian Prime Minister Modi has recently put laws in place severely reducing the rights of Muslims to Indian citizenship, saying Hindus come first.
