# What will happen with GCSEs?

- I. We know that GCSEs will not run in their 'normal' manner
- 2. Gavin Williamson has asked OFQUAL to find a fair way to award GCSE grades
- 3. On Friday Jan 15<sup>th</sup>, OFQUAL released their consultation documents
- 4. These are readily available
- 5. Students, Teachers, and Parents can respond to the document before Jan 29<sup>th</sup>

# Is there a summary of the consultation?

The main proposals/discussion of the consultation are below:

I.Decisions on final grades to be made as late as possible – this will keep engagement in learning (at home/in school) for as long as possible and will give students to opportunity to show what they can do.

2.Grades to be based on what has been achieved, as opposed to what 'would've' been achieved if full exams were sat – this will include any proposed assessments / mini exams which will be sat in the future (this is a different approach to GCSEs last year)

3.Exam boards could provide exam papers to help inform teachers in making their assessments – this could contain a mixture of different papers / multiple papers could be chosen



# Is there a summary of the consultation?

The consultation proposes/discusses the following aspects:

4.Coursework / NEA will be included in any decisions made – exam boards will provide more guidance on any weighting required

5.Schools can use their own papers to help inform assessments – formal tests / mocks could be used as evidence

6.Exam boards will provide support on grading – this would uniform/standardise the process, reducing risk of potential bias, and take into account events out of a student's control.



### **Fullbrook's Response**

- We will await the final publication from OFQUAL before making any firm decisions
- 2. We have experience from last year from which we can draw on. Fullbrook will have robust, valid, and reliable systems and processes in place
- 3. We are fully committed to our ethos of enabling every student to have the opportunity to be 'better than they ever thought they could be'
- 4. We do intend on running the second assessment window for Year 11s. However, in light of school closures, we will postpone this assessment window until we can be confident that students have enough time to prepare fully
