COVID-19 UPDATE

Yesterday a letter from Surrey County Council was emailed to parents and carers concerning the rise in the number of cases of COVID-19 in the Surrey area. This contains detailed advice about continuing to use the Lateral Flow Device tests twice a week and following government guidance on COVID-19 secure measures, Hands-Face-Space-Ventilation. With this in mind, it is more important than ever that students and staff continue to test themselves weekly using the Lateral Flow Device kits that we distribute. 



WHEN TO TAKE THE TEST

- If you have Covid-19 symptoms
- To confirm your positive lateral flow test results

HOW LONG IT TAKES

- These tests are processed in labs
- Up to 3 days, most results the next day

GET A TEST

- At home • At a test site

WITHOUT SYMPTOMS 'rapid lateral flow' test

WHEN TO TAKE THE TEST


- If you do not have symptoms of Covid-19
- As part of routine testing twice a week

HOW LONG IT TAKES

- Result processed by test device
- Around 30 minutes

GET A TEST

- At home • At a test site • At work
- At your nursery • At your secondary school
- At your university • Order on line
- Collect from a pharmacy



If you test positive you and your household must isolate. If you test positive with a lateral flow test, you must also book a confirmatory PCR test as soon as possible and **report your result to NHS test and trace**. To find out more visit www.surreycc.gov.uk/coronavirustesting




The LRC Recommends...
