VISIT FROM DR BEN SPENCER, MP

On Tuesday 22 February, we were delighted to welcome Dr Ben Spencer, MP for Runnymede and Weybridge to Fullbrook & Fullbrook 6 for a visit of the school.

The tour started with the school's breakfast catch up club which is supporting some of our most vulnerable students to catch up on lost learning due to the pandemic, then moved on to viewing the new wall art along the main corridor before meeting some of the Student Voice to hear about why the wall art project was important, and the fundraising efforts that have started to help make the next phase happen.

Next stop was Fullbrook 6, where Mr Clouston showed Dr Spencer the exciting plans for our sixth form extension, and how this development will benefit students moving forward. The final part of the tour allowed Dr Spencer to hear about the vital work that The Hub is doing to support students with emotional, social and mental health needs.

'LIVING WITH COVID-19': CHANGES TO GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE

After the government's announcements at the start of this week there are changes to COVID 19 measures between now and the start of April as restrictions are phased out. Please keep to the following guidance:

- Pupils/Students and staff should attend if they are well
- Pupils/Students and staff should stay at home if they are unwell.
 schools/settings should refuse entry to those that are symptomatic or unwell
- Have a PCR test if you have COVID-19 symptoms and stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you test positive for at least 5 full days.
 Then continue to follow the guidance (tests will remain available until the end of March 2022)
- Get vaccinated (if you wish to do so)
- · Let fresh air in if meeting indoors, or meet outside
- Wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces, especially where coming into contact with people you do not usually meet and when rates of transmission are high
- Wash your hands and following advice to "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it"

From 21 February the government has:

 Removed the guidance for staff and students in most education and childcare settings to undertake twice weekly asymptomatic testing.

From 24 February the government has:

- Removed the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Adults
 and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home
 and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue
 to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on
 consecutive days.
- No longer ask fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days, and remove the legal requirement for close contacts who are not fully vaccinated to self-isolate.

We will provide further information as relevant. Thank you for continuing to follow relevant guidance. Working together we can all stay safe and begin to move on with life in a less restricted way.


