FULLBROOK 6 SCORE EPIC WIN AGAINST WOKING COLLEGE

Wednesday saw another confident win from our outstanding U18 Men's Team. Despite some pre-match mind games from some former Fullbrook students who are now at Woking College, our boys were determined to put in a strong performance.

The first half of the game was hardfought, ending with F6 I-0 up following a confident header from Haydn F. A few minutes into the 2^{nd} half Woking College equalised which only served to galvanise the F6 team further. Goals from Jasper C, Matt W, Ben O and Matt C (2 including a penalty) followed to give a final score of 6-1 to Fullbrook 6.

Great teamwork, with all players excelling themselves to produce another accomplished result which sees them remain top of the league!



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COVID-19 UPDATE

Over the last few days an increasing number of students and staff have tested positive for COVID-19 and are now self-isolating. The numbers are particularly high in Year 7 and so from Monday 7/2/22 until we break up for half term on Friday 11/2/22, Year 7 students will be required to wear face coverings in corridors and communal areas. They will not have to wear them in classrooms at the moment. If possible, students in Year 7 should test more regularly than twice a week to try to keep the community as safe as possible. Please source tests locally, as we only have enough tests in school to issue to students for twice weekly testing.

The impact of COVID-19 on staff absence is increasing and supply agencies do not have any staff to help us cover lessons. As a result of these levels of teacher absence, other staff are giving up their time to cover lessons for their colleagues and we may have to combine classes in some subject areas to try to ensure that students continue to have face to face lessons.

We are doing everything we can to try to maintain education as normal for students in the run up to half term. Your support in encouraging your children to continue to work hard, even if they don't have their usual teacher, is very much appreciated.

WORD OF THE CYCLE
