Whole School Fundraising

In October 2021 the Year Team Council completed a student voice exercise asking all students to complete a survey which encouraged them to raise their ideas and concerns to the School Council and Senior Leadership Team. There was a very strong response rate from students and some excellent ideas to consider. There were a number of logistical ideas which were very sensible and could be actioned straightaway, an example allowing students who have PE period 5 to leave school in the PE kit, saving valuable learning time. One of the strongest points to be raised by students was the sense of disappointment in the internal visual aesthetics of the school. They expressed a desire for the school to become more visually inspiring and for damage to the walls to be repaired. Fullbrook has now begun an ambitious project to install visually stimulating and inspiring wall art throughout the school. These graphics are custom made to our specifications and the impressive wall art already installed along the main corridor features a 'timeline of equalities' which has been well-received by students and staff.

On Monday 7 February the Student Principals launched an exciting fundraising project with all students in Years 7 - 11. There is an ambitious target set of £25,000 which we hope to achieve by the end of the academic year. Students have been challenged to see if they can raise £30 each by sponsored activities in service to their families and the wider community. Student fundraising activities give the students a sense of ownership of the wall art project and also contributes to showing support of the whole school community. The money raised by students will contribute toward paying for repairs to the walls so that the wall art could be installed, the wall art project itself, and further developments to the fabric of the school over time.

We look forward to hearing about all of the fun and exciting ways that students raise their sponsorship, see their sense of pride in the community develop, and enjoy the improved visual aesthetics of their learning environment.

This programme will help students to value their environment and support them to continue to be 'better than they ever thought they could be'.
