COVID-19 UPDATE FROM SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL

We have received an update from Surrey CC with the latest national government guidance on managing respiratory infections, including Coronavirus (COVID -19). In essence, their advice is that Covid should be treated in a similar way to general respiratory infections.

Key things to be aware of include:

- Students with **mild symptoms** such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, **can continue to attend their education setting**.
- Students who are unwell and have a **high temperature should stay at home** and avoid contact with other people until they no longer have a high temperature
- If a student has a **positive covid test result** they should **stay at home for 3 days after the day they took the test** and avoid contact with other people
- Students who live with someone who has tested positive should continue to attend school as normal.

Please email <u>info@fullbrook.surrey.sch.uk</u> to let school know if a student tests positive for covid, or if a student is admitted to hospital owing to a respiratory infection.
