#### **CYCLE PERMIT REMINDER**

We are seeing increasing numbers of students who are only putting their helmets on when they approach the school gates (or when leaving, they take the helmet off once they are out of sight from the school gates). This is particularly prevelant with students in the upper years (9-11).
